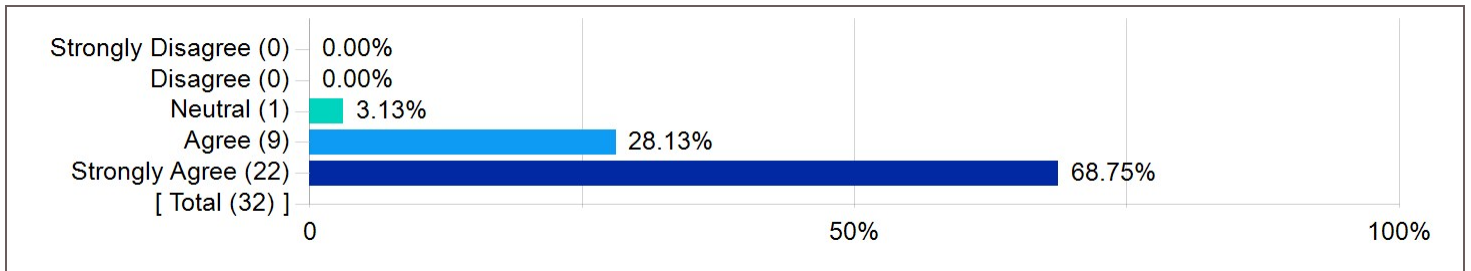

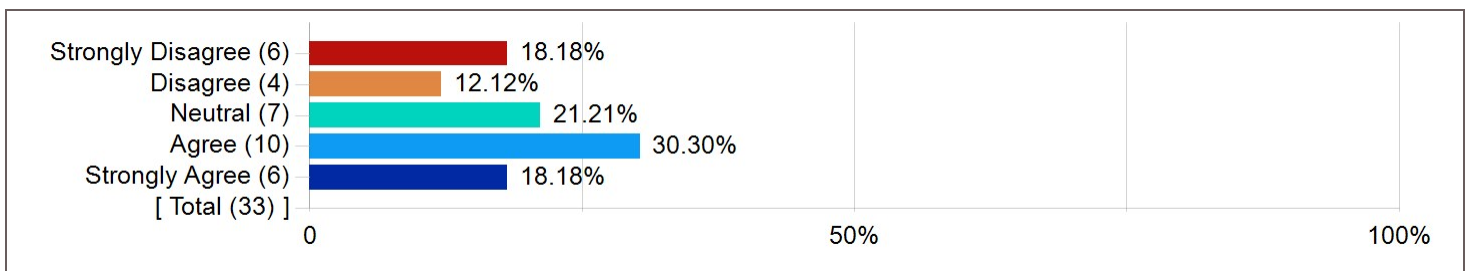

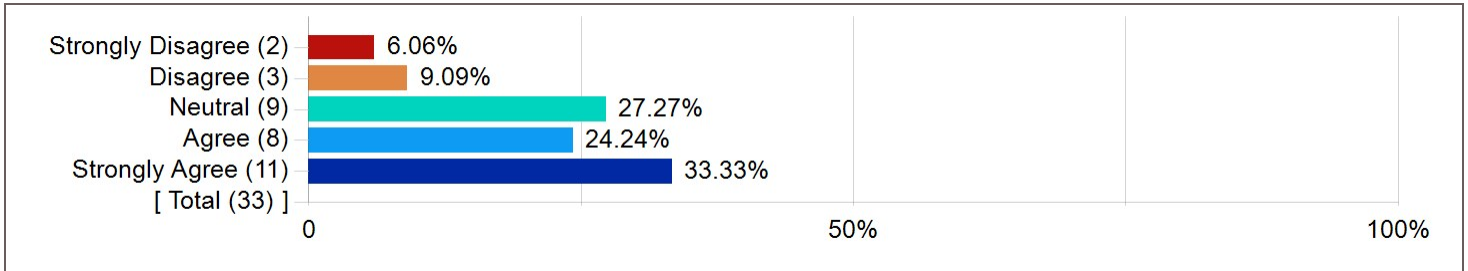

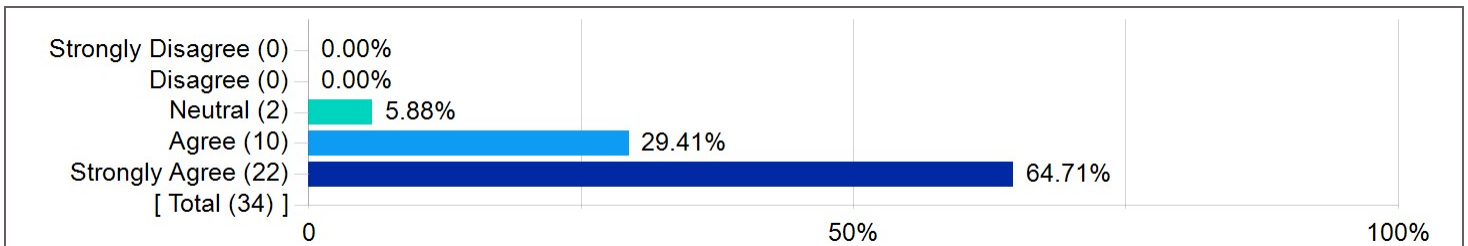

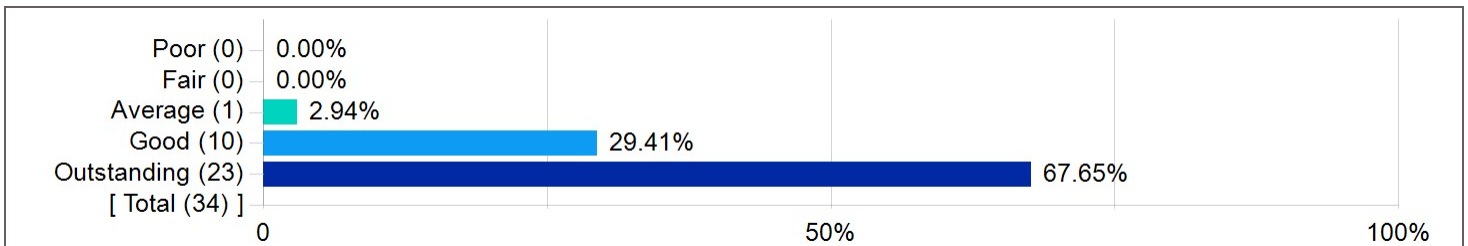
Questions Chosen by Instructor
