

# TEACHING EVALUATIONS

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I have been fortunate enough to teach many courses while at Rutgers University both as the instructor as well as a teaching assistant. These course evaluations are partially addressed in the letter written by Professor Luo. These evaluations are overwhelmingly positive, but to avoid the impression of bias, I have decided not to include selections of these either here or in my teaching statement.
