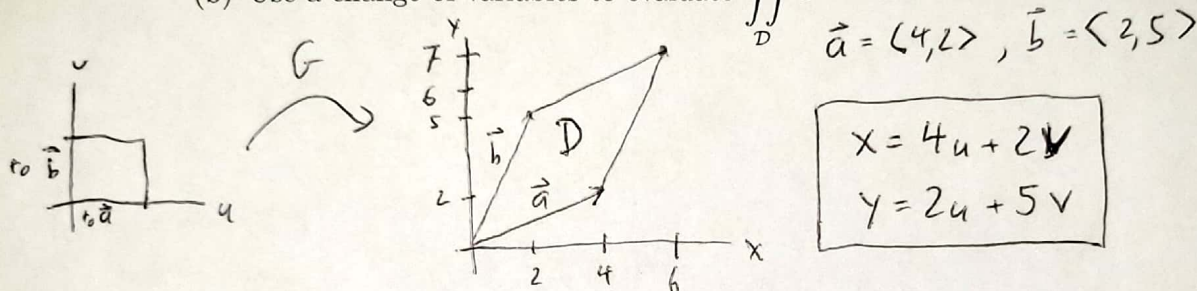

10 pts (1) Let \mathcal{D} be the parallelogram in the xy -plane with vertices $(0, 0)$, $(4, 2)$, $(2, 5)$, and $(6, 7)$.

(a) Find a linear mapping G that maps $[0, 1] \times [0, 1]$ in the uv -plane onto \mathcal{D} .

(b) Use a change of variables to evaluate $\iint_{\mathcal{D}} e^{x+2y} dA$.



$$\text{Jac}(G) = \begin{vmatrix} x_u & x_v \\ y_u & y_v \end{vmatrix} = \begin{vmatrix} 4 & 2 \\ 2 & 5 \end{vmatrix} = 20 - 4 = 16$$

$$f(x, y) = e^{x+2y}$$

$$f(u, v) = e^{(4u+2v) + 2(2u+5v)} = e^{8u+12v}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \iint_{\mathcal{D}} e^{x+2y} dA &= \int_0^1 \int_0^1 e^{8u+12v} |16| du dv \\ &= 16 \left(\int_0^1 e^{8u} du \right) \left(\int_0^1 e^{12v} dv \right) \\ &= 16 \left[\frac{1}{8} (e^8 - 1) \right] \left[\frac{1}{12} (e^{12} - 1) \right] \\ &= \frac{1}{6} (e^8 - 1)(e^{12} - 1) \\ &= \frac{e^{20} - e^{12} - e^8 + 1}{6} \end{aligned}$$
