a. $\{2, 1\} \in \{1, 2, \{1, 1, 2\}, \{\{1\}\}\}$. True \ False

b. $0 \in \{x^2 - x - 2 \mid x \in (0, 2)\}$. True \ False

c. $6 \in \{n \in \mathbb{N}_+ \mid \{m \in \mathbb{N} \mid 1 < m < n \wedge n \text{ is divisible by } m\} = \emptyset\}$.
