Dr. Cynthia Garvan is currently at the University of Florida, professor of Anesthesiology in their college of Medicine. She has obtained a master's in mathematics at Pennsylvania State University and went on to obtain a PhD in Statistics at the university of Florida, where she currently resides. She is currently the Statistics Director in the Office of Educational Research in the College of Education at the University of Florida and Co-Director of the Collaborative Assessment Program Evaluation Services (CAPES) group. Her involvement in the Ramanujan 1987 conference was to attend with her husband who is also a mathematician Frank Garvin. Majority of her research is in line with a mixture of medicine and statistic studies in medicine. Some recent publications have been with chronic pain, dermatology, and stress. Although she is listed on MathSciNet to only have 4 publications, those are only related to purely mathematical publications, as her total publication amount is over 100, in the medicinal field. Throughout her career, the combination of statistics and medicine can be seen when working on nationwide insurance studies with ADHD, as well as statistics in cognition.
