PROSPEROUS SONORO
The Present Conditions of Mining and Milling Interests in Sonora Along the Line of the Sonora Railway

To the editor of the Star.

Hermosillo, May 16- Commencing on the northern boundary, the first workings are about two and one half miles south and west of Nogales. This is an old Spanish mine and the remains of several erastras are still to be found, within one half mile of the mine. The old workings are being cleaned up and the average of the ore taken out carries 7 ounces of silver and 22 percent of copper to the ton. The property has been leased by a company, and the majority of the stock is held by the United States customhouse officials in Nogales.

The next point of interest is Agua Yarca, where there are some copper prospect holes that promise well. Near Inmina, 42 miles south of the line there has been considerable work done on a copper claim. The owners, Messers Latz and Bernard, of Magdalena, claims it carries 30 percent copper and 15 ounces of silverm and that they have a large amount of ore in sight.
